Howard approves proposal to pay for paramedic service

Sumacio still to vote on its part of measure

Residents in Howard and Sumacio soon could see quicker response by paramedics in their communities.

Under a proposal approved Monday night in Howard, both communities will pay County Rescue Services to staff the Howard station with a full-time paramedic 12 hours a day, seven days a week.

The move will shorten the response time for ambulances by six minutes to 11 minutes, depending on where the paramedic is called.

Howard — As Howard prepares for police contract talks with the Brown County Sheriff's Department, local leaders are trying to look at what services the department will need.

On Monday, the village board member Police Contract Ad Hoc Committee discussed its hopes and

needs to go. County Rescue officials said.

In each community, the paramedic pay for rescue services will increase to \$4.45 from \$3.77 a year, a jump of 18.3%. The Sumacio Town Board now must approve the contract, which would take effect immediately thereafter.

"Right now, we share rescue services, but we want to continue to work together," Town Manager Mike DeWisp said. "And it's more economical."

Currently, Howard and Sumacio pay County Rescue Services, a nonprofit corporation, to staff emergency medical technicians, or EMTs, in an office in the village's Village Works Building.

But paramedics, who have a more comprehensive level of medical education, have to be called in needed from the County Rescue Services station in Bellevue, resulting in a time-consuming trip over the Tower Drive Bridge or along Wisconsin 173 to U.S. 41 north.

County Rescue Director Tom Madigan said.

While some emergency medical technicians are able to administer some services to a certain level, paramedics are better trained for the most advanced techniques,

advisories available upon request, but only 1.2 million fishing licenses annually.

Along the Fox River, five areas are posted with warnings about eating the fish.

The DNR says that in the past, the signs have been defaced or removed by vandals.

Cathy Hantowski of the University of Wisconsin-Extension issued special notices for the local Southeast Asian community during Monday's meeting.
