A message of forgiveness and acceptance of God's will was heard Monday by hundreds attending the funeral of Eric Lee Zittlow, who died of a stab wound last week.

1705 S. Chanda St. — so many that extra chairs and even a few were added to the back of the church.

Zittlow, 34, was found Thursday afternoon, at her family's home, 141 Reimer St. She had been stabbed in the chest.

Her ex-boyfriend, Aaron Khoshdel, 35, 211 Rock St., was arrested by police and charged with first-degree murder.

Zittlow's immediate family, including her mother, Rose, and her father, Robert, were among those who spoke at her funeral.

Zittlow's death was a shock to her family and friends. She was a devoted mother and a loving wife.
