Howe center receives \$66,000 block grant
The city's Administration Authority on Thursday allocated \$66,000 in Community Development Block Grants to help the Howe Neighborhood Family Resource Center buy the former AAA building, 26 S. Monroe Ave.

The resource center recently bought the building. The latest grant is enough to pay off the mortgages according to center director Lisa Clark. However, the group still is raising money for renovations.

The total cost of buying and renovating the building was estimated at \$300,000.

Once the renovations are completed and the building is paid for, the resource center will donate the property to the school district.

The new building offers more space for the resource center to offer programs to people who live in the Howe School area. It will be in addition, since it is no longer shared space. It Howe School, the center will offer programs throughout the city.

The new center could be open by spring, and will be open by next school year at the latest.

Fire limits hunting in Mack Wildlife Area

The state Department of Natural Resources has closed part of the Mack Wildlife Area in Outagamie County to deer hunting because of a fire that burned in the area.

The fire, which started on Tuesday, Oct. 26, burned for several days and destroyed about 100 acres of forest. The fire was caused by a lightning strike, according to DNR officials.

Hunting is closed in the area until the fire is completely out and the area is safe for hunting. The closure is in effect until May 1, 2000.

PCB/ Reports delayed until May

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has delayed reports on polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) in the Fox River until May 2000.

The delay is due to a court order that requires the DNR to provide more information on the PCBs in the river. The court order was issued in a lawsuit filed by the American Rivers organization.

The DNR has been working to clean up the PCBs in the Fox River since 1980. The cleanup has been slow, and the PCBs continue to be found in the river.
