## Scientist-author to speak on PCBs

Colburn will focus on potential health risks

Then Colburn, a World Wildlife Fund senior scientist and author known for her controversial theories about PCBs, will talk about the chemical's potential health risks at a public meeting Monday, July 27, in Keshish.

Colburn and two federal associates will speak at the Fox River Valley in light of a federal proposal to list the Fox River as a Superfund cleanup site because of widespread PCB contamination from paper mills.

Colburn's theories about the effects of PCBs and other chemicals gained popular attention in her 1980 book *Our Stolen Future*, and have led to the study for concerns that reproductive and developmental problems now appearing in wildlife might also be reported in humans.
